

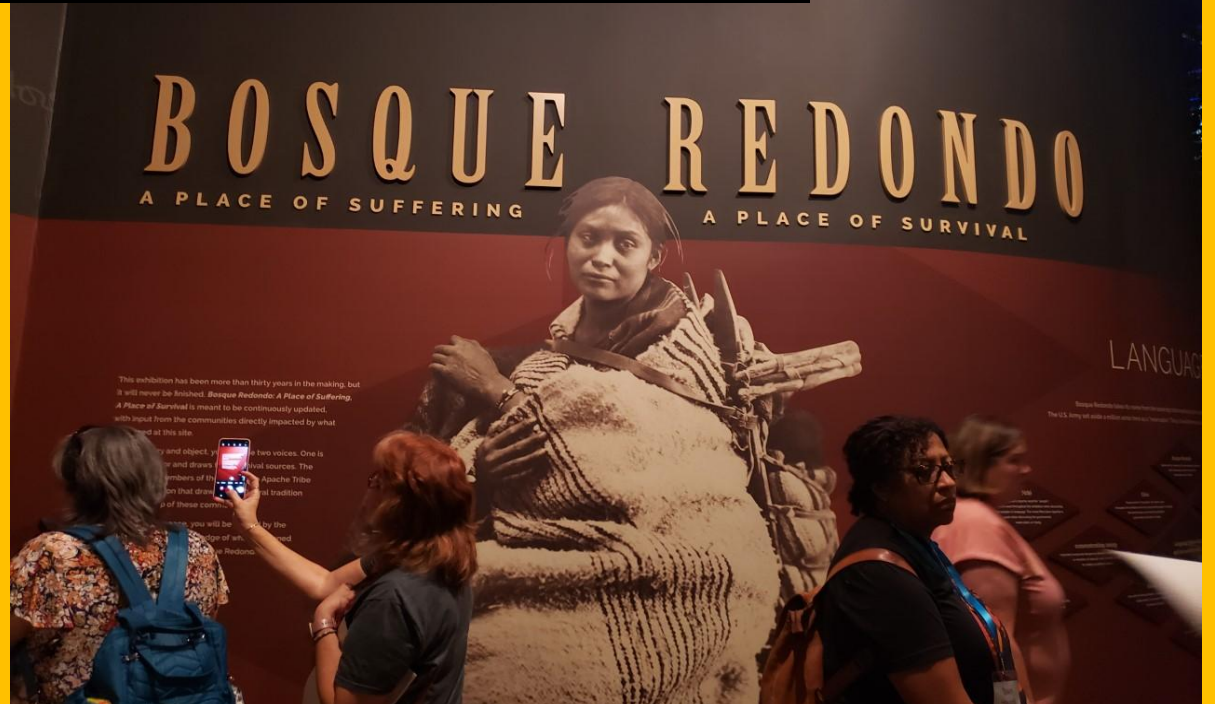
# First Annual GeoCivics Conference: Learning American History, Geography, and Civics Through A Different Lens
